Report on the Audit of the Consolidated Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of **PHAROAHS SKILLS LIMITED ("the Company")** which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2025, the Statement of Profit and Loss, Cash Flow Statement and the Statement of changes in Equity for the year ended, and a summary of the of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Opinion

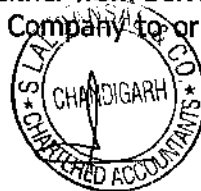

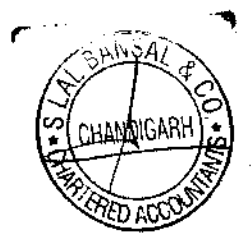

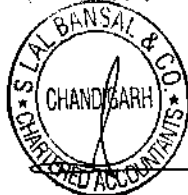

Because of the inherent limitations of internal financial controls over financial reporting, including the possibility of collusion or improper management override of controls, material misstatements due to error or fraud may occur and not be detected. Also, projections of any evaluation of the internal financial controls over financial reporting to future periods are subject to the risk that the internal financial control over financial reporting may become inadequate because of changes in conditions, or that the degree of compliance with the policies or procedures may deteriorate.
